

SUNDAY SCHOOL WORKSHEET FOR JANUARY 2025

2nd Sunday, Jan. 12th – “JESUS SEEKS OUT ZACCHAEUS” – Luke 19:1-10

LESSON AIM: to demonstrate Jesus' love for all people; to understand the joy that comes from placing faith in Jesus for salvation

MONDAY – JANUARY 6TH

LUKE 18:18-30 LEARN JEREMIAH 33:3

1. What information did the ruler want Jesus to tell him?

2. By what title does the ruler address Jesus?

3. Instead of immediately addressing the man's question, what part of what the ruler says *does* Jesus immediately address and why?

4. When Jesus does address the ruler's inquiry, what does Jesus tell him?

5. Look at verse 21, do you believe the ruler is really being truthful in response to Jesus... why or why not?

6. Instead of challenging the ruler's assertion about all he *had* done, what does Jesus tell him he needs to do?

7. Explain why you believe the ruler was sorrowful when he heard what Jesus told him to do.

8. Why do you believe (as Jesus said to the ruler), it is hard for the wealthy to enter the kingdom?

9. What analogy does Jesus use to show the unlikeliness of the wealthy entering the kingdom?

10. How do those hearing Jesus' remark about the wealthy react, and why do they react this way?

11. What did Jesus mean by the statement "The things which are impossible with men are possible with God" strictly in this context?

12. Sum up how Jesus responds when Peter tells Him they had left everything to follow Him.

TUESDAY - JANUARY 7TH**LUKE 18:31-43 LEARN JEREMIAH 33:3**

1. Who does Jesus specifically take aside to speak specifically to?

2. What does Jesus tell them *shall be* fulfilled?

3. What specifically does Jesus tell them will be done to Himself when He goes to Jerusalem?

4. What was the response of the disciples to what Jesus told them would happen to Him in Jerusalem?

5. What does verse 35 say occurred as Jesus was approaching the city of Jericho?

6. What alerted this person (your answer to #5) that something was going on?

7. How does this person react when he is told what was going on?

8. What did the folk that 'went before' (who were out in front) do to the man when he did this (your answer to #7)?

9. Even though the folk did this to him (your answer to #8), what does the man do?

10. Why do you believe the man did this (your answer to #9)?

11. How does Jesus respond to the man's pleading?

12. When asked by Jesus what he wanted Him to do for him, how does the man answer?

13. Why do you believe the man gave Jesus this answer?

14. Why do you believe Jesus tells the man that his faith had saved him?

15. What is the man's response to his healing?

WEDNESDAY - JANUARY 8TH**LUKE 19:1-10 LEARN JEREMIAH 33:3**

1. What city was Jesus entering into?

2. Who was Zacchaeus?

3. What was it that Zacchaeus was seeking to do?

4. Why couldn't Zacchaeus do what he was seeking to do?

5. What did Zacchaeus do since he was not having any success accomplishing what he was seeking?

6. What did Jesus do when He came to the place Zacchaeus was?

7. Explain what Zacchaeus did when told by Jesus that He had to stay at his house that day.

8. What were all the people who saw the exchange between Jesus and Zacchaeus complaining about?

9. What are some things in verse 8 that stand out as showing Zacchaeus' confession is from a repentant heart?

10. What does Jesus mean in verse 9 when He says that Zacchaeus is 'also a son of Abraham'?

11. Explain verse 10 in context.

THURSDAY – JANUARY 9TH**LUKE 19:11-27 LEARN JEREMIAH 33:3**

1. Why, according to verse 11, did Jesus begin to speak the following parable?

2. Why, according to verse 12, did the nobleman go into a far country?

3. Explain what verse 13 says he gave his ten servants and his instructions to them.

4. How did the citizens of the nobleman's country feel about him?

5. What did the nobleman do upon returning to his home?

6. What report did the first servant give to the nobleman when summoned by him?

7. What commendation was given to this servant for what he had done?

8. What report was given by the second servant?

9. What was his commendation for his service?

10. What was the report given by the third servant?

11. What judgment was given to this servant and why?

12. What judgment does the nobleman pronounce on his enemies?

13. Sum up the main point of this parable.

FRIDAY – JANUARY 10TH

LUKE 19:28-48 LEARN JEREMIAH 33:3

1. What did Jesus send two of His disciples into the village to do?

2. What happened when these two entered the village?

3. What did they do once they had brought the colt to Jesus?

4. What happened when Jesus began His descent from the Mt. of Olives to Jerusalem?

5. How do the Pharisees react to what the multitude is doing?

6. What answer does Jesus give the Pharisees in response?

7. What did Jesus do as He got closer to Jerusalem?

8. What historical event is Jesus predicting in verses 43-44?

9. What does Jesus do immediately upon entering the temple?

10. Why did Jesus do this (your answer to #9)?

11. What was Jesus doing on a daily basis while in Jerusalem?

12. Explain what hindered the chief priests and scribes from finding a way to kill Jesus.
